The Hobby Division of the Morrow County Fair is one of the most popular places, for both exhibitors and viewers. With many talented artists in the county, it was necessary to add new lots, life in these categories. A in the '72 Premium Book. The following additions have been made and all residents are encouraged to enter in as many of the different categories as possible. Only one entry may be made in any one class by each exhibitor.

There will be a class for Ceramics, finished since the '71 Fair and not exhibited before at Morrow County Fairs. Under this class there will be Wheel Thrown Objects, done without the use of a mold; with a special section for bowls, vases, plates, figurines, and cups; Glazed Greenware, special section for lace, plain figurines, detailed figurines, lamps, miscellaneous small articles, vases, wall plaques, ash trays, candy dishes, cookie jars, bowl and pitcher, planter, cup, utility pitcher category for Abstract Art Stained Greenware.

Under a category for Art come these divisions: Brushwork, Oil; Palette Knife, Oil; Charcoal; Watercolor; and Ink; with special divisions for landscapes, still life, seascapes, portraits, and animal life in these categories. A category for Abstract Art has also been added, with special divisions for pure abstract, cubism and symbolic art.

Superintendents in this division will be Mabel Heath, Heppner; and Mary Lou Carlson, Lexington. There will be a demonstration on ceramics by Mrs. Carlson, and an art demonstration by Shirley McNary, Ione. Time and date of these is mentioned elsewhere in this paper.
