WEEKLY RECIPE

Sarah Anne Sheridan
Chocolate Cake
2 c all-purpose flour
2 c sugar
1 stick margarine
1/2 c shortening
1 c water
4 T cocoa
1/2 c buttermilk
2 eggs
1 t cinnamon
1 t soda
1 t vanilla

Blend first two ingredients and set aside. Bring the next four ingredients to a rapid boil and pour over flour and sugar mixture. Stir to blend. Add remaining ingredients and mix well. Grease and flour an 11x14 inch pan and bake mixture approximately 25 minutes at 350 degrees.

Chocolate Icing

1 stick margarine
6 T milk
4 T cocoa
1 box powdered sugar (less 1/2 cup)
1 c nuts
1 t vanilla

Bring first three ingredients to a rapid boil. Remove from heat and add last three. Blend and ice warm cake with hot icing.
