

**SPI Inspection Fees are RE Revised Upward**

Minimum service charges for Federal-State Shipping Point Inspection Service inspections of produce by the SPI will be raised from \$7.25 to \$12.50 under a new fee schedule that becomes effective August 1, 1972.

The fee revisions are necessary to meet the requirement that the service be self supporting and they follow a July 6, 1972, hearing at which no persons appeared to testify for or against the proposed revisions in certain fees. The last time the fee schedule was revised prior to this was September, 1969.

Other major revisions in the regulations covering the SPI inspection fees include: An increase from 9 cents per mile to 10 cents per

mile in the mileage rate charged for inspections.

The increase to \$8 per hour from \$7.25 per hour in the hourly rate for inspections.

An increase to \$3 from \$2 in the minimum certificate fee.

A charge of 4 1/2 cents per hundred weight for inspections of all fresh market onions instead of the 4 cents per hundredweight now charged.

A 4 1/2 cents per hundred-weight fee charge for fresh market potato inspections, an increase of one cent per hundredweight over the present fee.

Charges of \$6.00 per hour in addition to the regular inspection fee for overtime. The overtime charge in addition to the regular rate now is \$5.50 per hour.

Raised the hourly fee for securing fumigation certificates from \$7.25 to \$8.00 per hour.

Sets a service charge of \$3.00 per telegram to Canada when it is necessary because a shipper did not secure inspection and a fee of \$1.00 if the inspection has been secured but the shipper requests the telegram to verify inspections service. In addition to this the shipper also

pays cost of the telegram.

Provides for incentive fees to applicants using the SPI service under contractual agreements for continuous quality control type inspectors.

And, allows the service to make an extra charge for inspection when the applicant uses more than three hours for inspection of lots containing 50,000 pounds or less.
