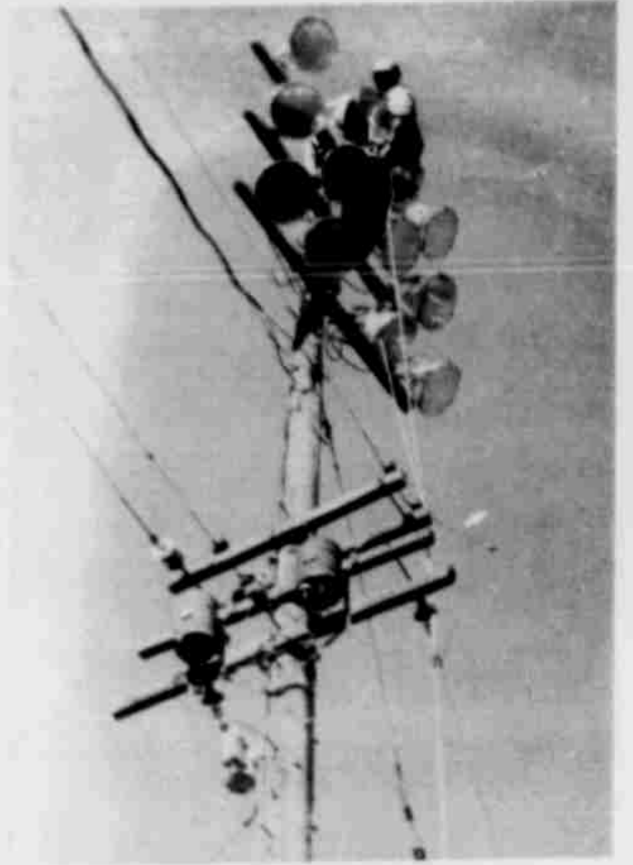
REMEMBER WHEN!
