Kirk Robinson had the Grand Champion FFA beef weighing 998 pounds. And Judy Bennett had the FFA Reserve Grand Champion beef.

Other awards made to Kirk Robinson: the Oregon Pollette award for best FFA Polled Hereford female of the show. A belt buckle for the Oregon Hereford Assn. for the best Hereford project. Plaques from the American Hereford Assn. for the Grand Champion female Hereford and for the Grand Champion market steer.

In the tractor driving contest, trophies were awarded by the Oregon Farm Bureau: First, Bill Acock; 2nd, Kyle Robinson; third, Tom Cutsforth. The C. W. Acock and Son trophy for the best horned Hereford female went to Bill Acock.

Mrs. McQuarrie left Saturday to drive to Roseburg to be with the family.

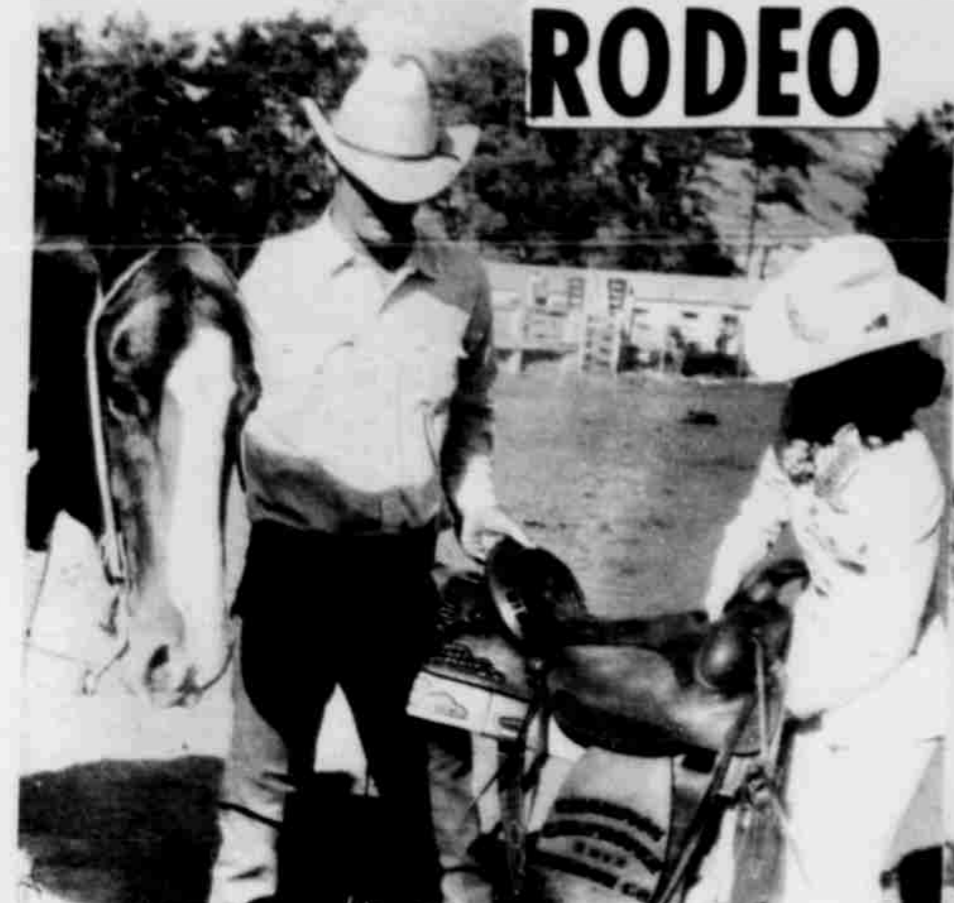
## visit
