Kent Gutierrez ran 52 yards for a TD on the second play in the first half. In the last half, he added successful runs of 10 and 45 yards for a total of 134 yards in six carries. Jerry Pettyjohn, Aaron Klinger and Bob Gates also scored TDs for the Cardinals.

The Ione defense excelled to hold Cascade Locks to 26 yards net gain. Cascade Locks completed 10 of 15 passes but five were for minus yardage. The Cardinals threw only three passes completing one with one interception.

Coach Meyers played everybody. On the starting lineup were Tom Gates, Ed Winkelman, Jon Rietmann, Paul Ashurst, Mark Rietmann, Dick Snider, Jerry Pettyjohn and Kent Gutierrez.
