

### Heppner High Athletic Code

The following athletic code has been adopted by the Heppner High School coaching staff and is in accord with the policy of the Morrow County Board of Education and also consistent with the suggested policy of the U.S.A.A.

This code shall apply to all students participating in interscholastic athletics sponsored by Heppner High School. Any athlete not conforming to the letter of this code shall be subject to disciplinary action as prescribed below.

#### TRAINING:

1. Athletes are to refrain from the use of tobacco in any form. First offenders will receive two weeks suspension during which time they will not be permitted to participate in any game, meet, or match. Second offenders will be suspended for the remainder of the season.

2. Any athlete involved with the use of alcohol or other hard drugs or the exchange thereof shall be suspended for the remainder of the season. This shall include any one who is convicted for minor-in-possession.

3. Any athlete being suspended from a sport will be on a

probationary status. During this time he will be expected to abide by the training rules. If he wishes to participate in future sports he will have his case reviewed by the coaches, principal, and counselors to see if the individual should be allowed to participate. This will be done prior to the start of the sport season he wishes to participate in.

4. Team members are to observe sensible hours and are expected to be home by 10:00 p.m. the night prior to a game, meet, or match.

**PARTICIPATION:**  
1. Any athlete dismissed from a team for disciplinary reasons shall not participate in another sport during that original sport season nor use school facilities for training for a coming sport.

2. No athlete may work out for a coming sport season without the express permission of all head coaches whose sport is currently in progress.

3. Any student having unauthorized school equipment shall not be permitted to participate on an athletic team, receive an athletic award, or recommendation from the coach until the

matter is settled to the satisfaction of the school authorities.

#### ATHLETIC AWARDS:

An athlete must have been a member in good standing at the close of a sport season be eligible for any award that may be given.

#### ATTENDANCE:

All athletes are expected to maintain good attendance to all classes. Any absence must be legitimate. Any absence from a regularly scheduled practice session without the coach's authorization, either by prearrangement or by a valid excuse from home, shall be disciplined at the discretion of the coach in charge.

#### DRESS:

On the day of a scheduled contest, all participating athletes shall attend school wearing a shirt and tie, and either one of these three, an award sweater, sport jacket, or dress sweater. The trousers should be appropriate to the above. Any form of denim jacket or trousers are taboo.

#### GROOMING:

Head hair shall be reasonable length, no pig shave or long hair (definition of long hair-if the hair extends to the eyes or, as in basketball, causes the athlete to constantly flip the hair from his vision then the hair is considered to

be too long). Also, as a health precaution, hair should not be long and thick enough to make it difficult to dry properly following a shower as this causes the athlete to be more susceptible to contracting a cold or other related illness. Facial hair is limited to a maximum of moderately long sideburns, neatly trimmed. (This means that a mustache, or mutton chops, or beard are taboo).

Every Student who turns out for a sport sponsored by Heppner High School is expected to practice good citizenship at home, school, and community. He is on parade and is expected to be an ambassador of Heppner High School's athletic program to the Nth degree.

All athletes turning out, are expected to accept the above code in the spirit it is written and abide by it for the entire year. This must occur if an athlete wishes to excel and also be loyal to himself, his team, his schoolmates, and his school and coaches.
