Before plunging into the review proper a tribute was presented to Jackie Robinson whose death occurred that morning. Then the book's author was re-introduced verbally - WALK IN THE SPIRIT by Red Barber was published in 1969 by The Dial Press, Inc. N.Y. Radio announcer and sports-journalist Barber was inspired to write the 21 brief, vivid chapters because his work had afforded him contact with many inspiring examples of human courage and other high qualities of character in some of the great sports figures of the last thirty years. A devout Christian encouraged by the early and careful guidance of his parents, he presents in this book highly personal reflections on, and portraits of men and their accomplishments, in many cases from private interviews.
