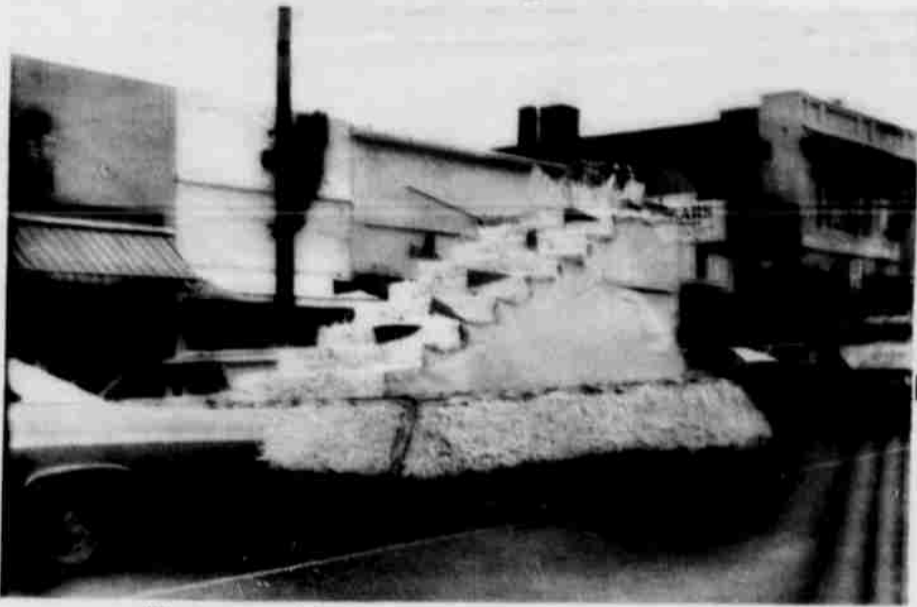


HHS Homecoming Floats
