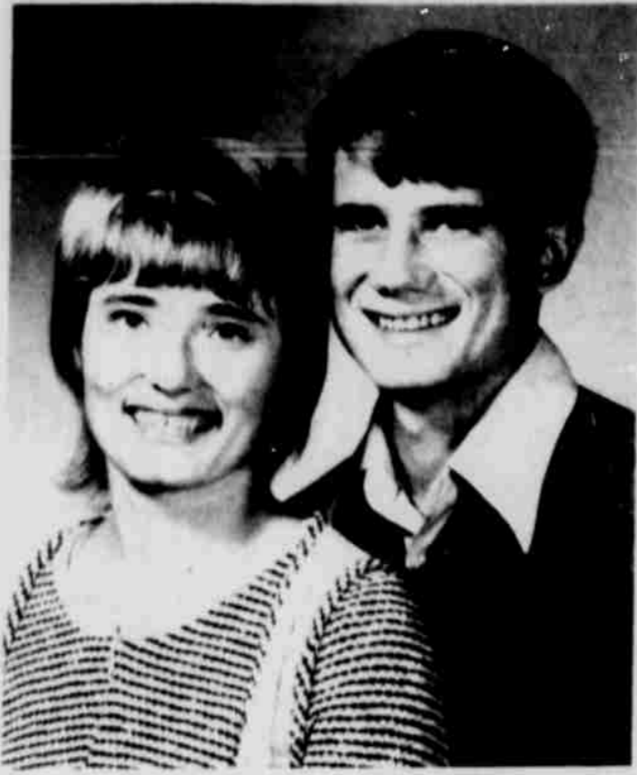
Assisting Cindy with the many lovely gifts were Mrs. Frank Halvorsen and Miss D. Ann Barnett, both of Ione.
