

Several people have asked what is really going to go on in the Mental Health Services. Certainly people who have been going over to Pendleton for mental health services can testify that there is nothing mystical about what goes on in an interview with a therapist or in group therapy.

The thing that makes an interview with a therapist more than just talking is that the therapist is able to understand the dynamics of the situation and can effect the discussion in such a way as to be helpful to the individual. He can raise pertinent, thought-provoking questions. He can point out subtle factors that may escape recognition by those directly involved.

The therapist tries to help the patient see various alternatives to his problems and also provides encouragement and reassurance as the patient attempts to carry out the solution he has chosen.

The therapist is interested in all people with problems. Rather than telling a person what to do, he attempts to help the person help himself. The individual still has the right to determine for himself what he should do about his problem.


