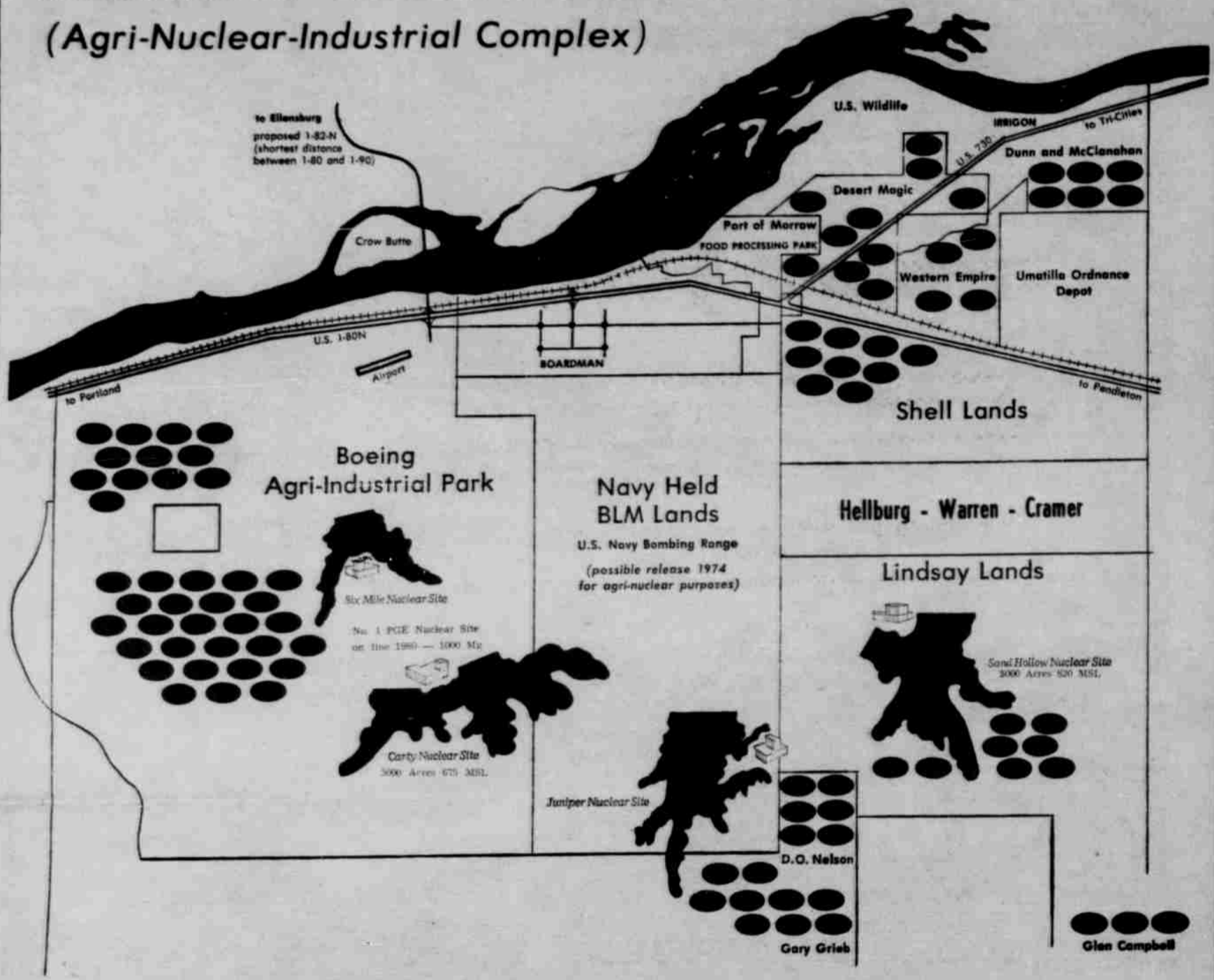


MORROW COUNTY'S NUPLEX

Morrow County people at the Jan. 19th Hearing put themselves into the Nuclear Age! This date may be a turning point in Morrow County history.

This means tremendous investments and developments, jobs and livelihood for our young people.

The 140,000 acres of fallow land below the Bombing Range, that raises a crop every other year and pays taxes every year should be raising Non-Surplus Diversified crops each year—a great addition to our economy.

The Navy, Lindsay, Shell, Hellburg and Boeing lands should add 140,000 acres of circles. Morrow County should be Oregon's greatest agricultural producer—if we will capture our fair share of the unused Columbia River water through Power Producing Nuclear Plants.

Port of Morrow Commission

Nuclear Sites:

Morrow County nuclear sites, promoted by the Port of Morrow, do not in any way interfere with the public interest as an ocean and river frontages. They are all located on privately controlled recirculating cooling reservoirs with very good buffer areas.

Irrigation:

Our nuclear plants and reservoirs employ the multiple use development concepts. They will help our farmers irrigate land and provide ground water recharge, recreation, fish and wildlife habitat, city and industrial water storage and many other beneficial uses, such as re-cycling metropolitan organic wastes back to the soil.

Industry:

Industry can benefit tremendously from the availability of nuclear power, warm water and tax advantages on the Port of Morrow waterfront industrial park, the Port's food processing park and the Boeing agri-industrial park.

People:

The people of Morrow County are a very receptive citizenry. They have accepted and endorsed, after advertised public hearings, nuclear power plants with only one dissent. The Port of Morrow enjoys working for our people, especially our young people.
