Columbia Basin Property Exchanges

The Board of Directors of Columbia Basin Electric approved two property transactions at the Board Meeting on March 22.

A resolution was adopted approving purchase of 6.3 miles of single phase line from Wasco Electric Coop located southwest of Fossil. Six consumer-members are involved for the \$5,852.99 purchase price.

Also approved was a sale of two (2) miles of three phase

line, serving no consumer-members, to Pacific Power & Light Co. The line was to have been removed since it was in area sold to Pacific Power & Light Co. The line can be utilized by Pacific Power, so a sale was effected.

The Wasco Electric Coop was interested in turning the area and consumers over to Columbia Basin so that better service would be provided, and would result in being closer to service facilities and closer to maintenance services.
