

Hope Vanishes for Capsized Victims

Hope for the lives of Ed Williams and Jack Bowman, whose boat capsized and sank in the rapids at the mouth of the Innaha River two weeks ago, has been abandoned. The sheriff's office at Lewiston reports that, while regular sweeps of the Snake River continue, it may be weeks before their bodies are recovered and that they may be found as far downstream as Ice Harbor Pool.

Harbor Pool

Williams, a high school teacher and coach at Lewiston for many years, had served several terms as Representative from Nez Perce Co. to the State Legislature. He had been instrumental in the election of Cecil Andrus as Governor of Idaho and had served as the Governor's executive assistant for several months. He resigned that position last April to run for the vacancy in the U.S. Congress created when Len Jordan retired as Senator, and Representative James McClure decided to run for the Senate spot. He was defeated in his bid for the Congressional post by Representative Symms from Southern Idaho. Later Williams was appointed to the Northwest Planning Commission on which he was serving at the time of his death.

Williams and Bowman had arranged to pick up a hiking party at Pittsburg Landing. The party had hiked down-river from Hell's Canyon over the weekend. The pick-up had been made, and the boat was proceeding downstream at the time of the accident. All six members of the hiking party were rescued following the sinking of the boat.

Williams was a younger brother of Clifford Williams, who has taught school for several years in Heppner and Lone.

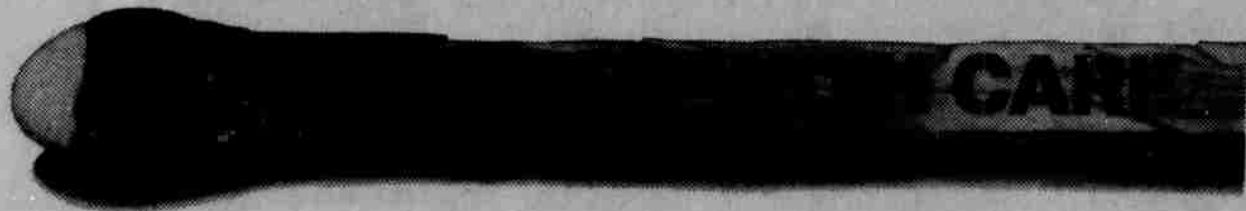
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
