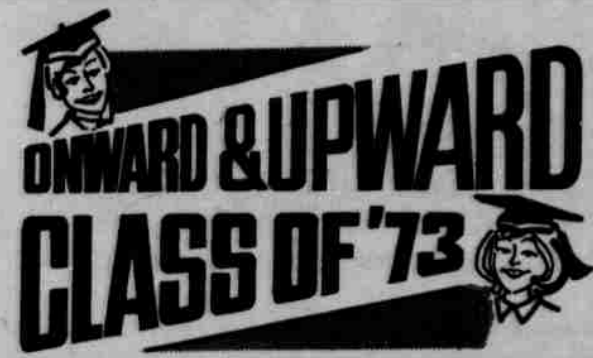

After the impoundment, owners of unauthorized cattle may regain possession thereof only by first showing proof of ownership and reimbursing the United States in full for the expense incurred in impounding, feeding, and care of such cattle.
