Principal Dan Daltoso will present the awards and Gerald Peck, chairman Morrow County School board will present the diplomas.

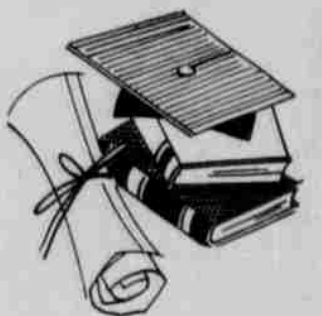
The class motto is "Our glory lies in not ever falling...but rising every time we fall". Their class flower is roses and carnations and the class colors are blue, black and silver.
