"Plant Jewels of the High Country"

The Ione Garden Club held their May 9 meeting at Mrs. Kenneth Klinger's home in Lexington with Mrs. W. H. I. Padberg as co-hostess. "PLANT JEWELS OF THE HIGH COUNTRY" was the fascinating program presented by Mrs. Fred Martin on Sempervivums and Sedums - hardy succulents of rock gardens. Known by other names: hen & chicks, old man & woman, houseleeks, live-forever and stonecrop, these plants are regaining a respected place in home gardens and are ideal for gardeners with limited space and time. Sempervivums and Sedums are not related to cacti although all are succulents that store moisture in roots and leaves to withstand drought and cannot stand poor drainage. For garden purposes they have been informally divided into the following groups: "Cobwebs" covered with spidery web, "Velvets" with downy hair on back and front of leaves, "Rollers" with chicks perched on top, smooth leaved type, fringed and tufted and those without chicks. Their colors range from pale chartreuse, silver blue, lavender, darkest purple, many shades of red, from a velvet-tinged pink to
