CHANGES SET FOR FAIR GROUNDS

Paint jobs on some worn spots will be the main improvements that take place at the Morrow County Fair Pavilion before fair begins.

Bright red will cover the

barns and green will cover the buckaroo grandstand when the painting is completed. New steel doors will replace the doors in the fair pavilion, for both the single and double-door exits. Painting inside the building will be done only where

needed. Four half-barrels have been donated to the fair pavilion by the National Honor Society from Heppner High. The green barrels, like those on Main Street, will be filled with flowers and used to decorate

different areas of the grounds. Mrs. C.J. D. Bauman is still general superintendent of the fair pavilion. New grounds keeper is Jim Mouahan. The next meeting of the Fair Board will be June 15, 8:00 p.m., in the Boardman City Hall.

COUNCIL REJECTS STREET DIPS

A proposed plan to put dips across Water and W. Morgan Streets to slow traffic, approved last month by the council, was rejected in a special city council meeting May 29.

The speed dips were to aid in the controlling of traffic to and from the high school, but the

city's engineering firm and the State Highway Commission in Salem advised the council against the move. Since school has been dismissed for the year, action on the speeding problem will be delayed until next fall. The resignation from Glen Kalkhorst, Chief of Police, was accepted, effective at noon, July 2. He was granted a leave

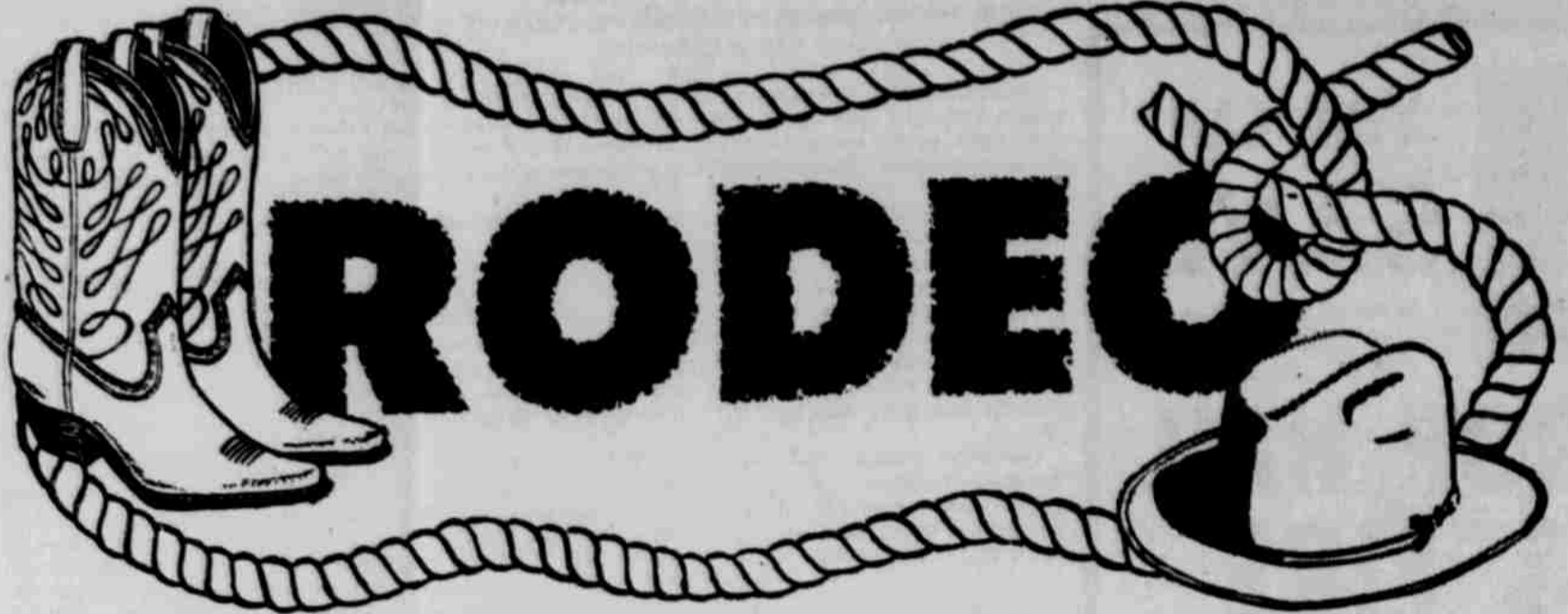
of absence from June 1 to July 2. John Messick was approved as a new member of the City Budget Committee. A permit for the garbage disposal site was not renewed, in view of the program being worked out, but the city was asked to continue to operate the site in the best possible manner and to support the statewide solid waste management plan-

ning efforts. There was much discussion about the city's water situation. Bert Corbin reported that air in the water pipes is caused from shutting off and turning the water back on during repair operations, and the problem could be corrected with approximately \$250.00 worth of new equipment to tap the main line whenever this occurs.
