

Early Rock Crusher

Adorno Cunnings Crowell, a long-time Morrow County resident who passed away May 28 in Heppner, led an interesting life in this area after his marriage in 1907 to LaUna Mae Jackson.

The couple moved to Salem early in 1908 where Mr. Crowell was employed as a crusher man for the Warren Construction Company. Then in 1916, the couple moved to Morrow County where Mr. Crowell continued his work in the construction field. He crushed the first rocks for Heppner's streets and for the highway from Witeman's to Jones' hill during 1918. In 1924 the couple moved to a ranch on lower Willow Creek which is still in the family. Finally, due to his illness, Mr. and Mrs. Crowell were forced to move into Ione. In 1963 Mr. Crowell entered the Pioneer Nursing Home and in 1970 Mrs. Crowell entered the Nursing home to be with her husband.

Johnson Van Marter Passes

It was reported that Johnson Van Marter, 78, had dropped dead Saturday morning at his home in Yakima. He was a brother of La Verne Van Marter, Sr. of Heppner.
