## Judge Reviews Revenue Sharing . . . Legislation

"In effect, revenue sharing has reduced taxes in Morrow County in that the money has been used to keep taxes from being raised that much more", Judge Jones told members of the Heppner-Morrow County Chamber of Commerce Monday.

He explained that Revenue sharing funds must be spent in 24 months after receiving them and to be obligated in 18 months. By law, the revenue sharing funds can't be used as a direct tax off-set.

At first the Serial Road Levy was set at \$185,000, but anticipating the use of Revenue Sharing for part of the road improvement, the Serial Levy was reduced to \$145,000. "Which has of course reduced the amount that had to be raised by taxes".

The budget committee will carry over \$50,000, as a sinking fund. Several thousand went into roads and \$8000, has been designated for repairs of the Court House. The Circuit Court room, has been air conditioned. The jail may be repaired.

According to the requirements, part of the Revenue Sharing is supposed to go for Human Needs. The budget at one time cut the funds for the Neighborhood Center which primarily deals with the needs of the senior citizens. A large delegation and petitions signed by 210 individuals urging the Budget committee to keep the Neighborhood Center represented the program. "Nothing caused more debate" and it was finally agreed, not unanimous.

Another bill passed will reduce the amount Morrow County has been receiving from the liquor revenues. The amount not paid to the county will be used in cities and counties where there is a detoxification or treatment center.

"SB100 passed in its amended form was the most cussed and discussed bill and has to do with land use and land use planning." 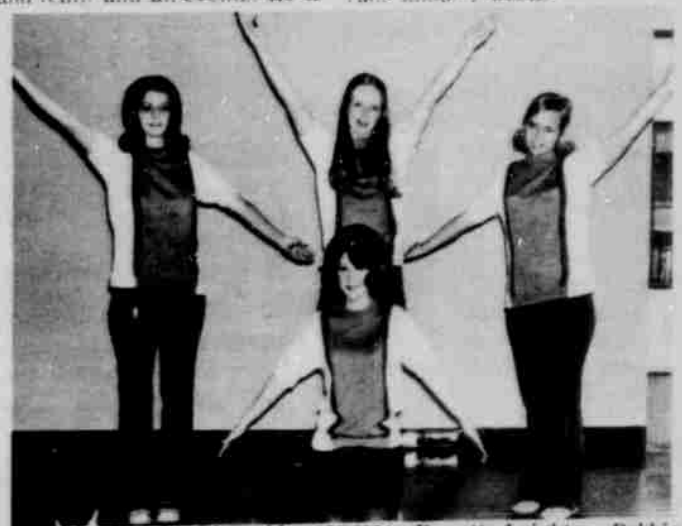
Princess Kathy is a member of the Ione United Church of Christ and Rainbow Riding her horse "Little Joe," swimming, skiing and sewing are her hobbies.
