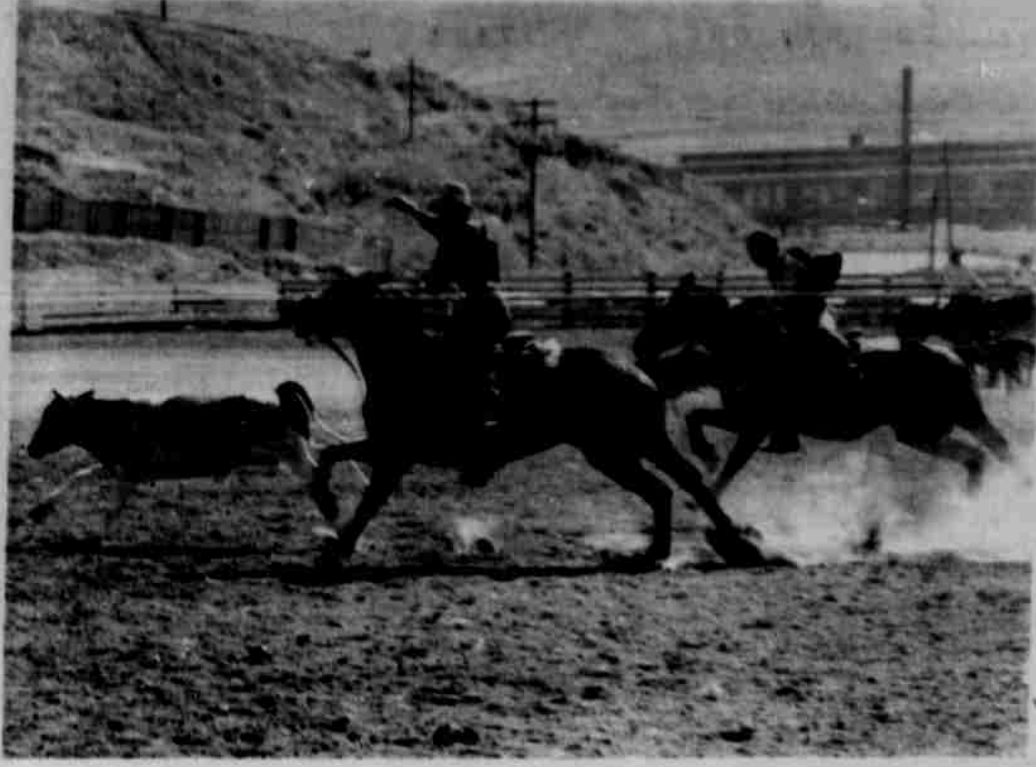
The All-Around champions were each presented horse blankets donated by Ruggles Boyce.

### WHAT'S COOKIN'?

**Franks 'N Beans Special**

- 4 frankfurters
- 6 tiny boiling onions, halved
- 12 chunks dill pickle
- 1/2 cup french dressing
- 2 cans (1 lb) cans New England Style Baked Beans
- 1 tbsp molasses
- 2 tsp sugar

Cut franks in 4 pieces with onion halves, pickle chunks, marinate in French Dressing about 1/2 hour, turning occasionally. Mix beans, molasses, sugar in casserole. Place franks on 4 skewers with onion and pickle between pieces making "kebobs". Place on top of beans with skewers pointed toward center. Bake 350 degrees about 30 minutes or until beans are hot.

**French Apple Pudding**

- 3 cups applesauce
- 8 graham crackers, crumbled
- 3 tsp. brown sugar
- 3/4 tsp. cinnamon
- Dash of nutmeg
- 1/4 cup melted butter

Put applesauce in shallow baking dish. Mix graham crackers, sugar, cinnamon and nutmeg and combine with melted butter. Sprinkle over applesauce. Bake 350 degrees 35-40 minutes. Serve warm with whipped cream or vanilla ice cream.
