

# Ione Girl Plans European Tour

Christina Lindstrom, 18, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Roy W. Lindstrom of Ione is leaving Oakland, Ca. June 25 for a six weeks vacation and study tour of five different European countries. She will be studying on campuses in Sussex, Paris, Munich, and Florence. Lectures and discussions will be supplemented by visits and excursions to places of related social and historical interest. The students will also spend carefully planned visits to Strasburg, Innsbruck, Venice and Rome. From Rome, Christina will fly back to the United States on Aug. 5.

The trip is arranged by Scholastic International, a private educational corporation, which was founded in 1920, and publishes Scholastic Magazine, books, records and audio visual material as well as planning a variety of study tours.

Christina, who graduated from Ione High School in May, is a National Honor Society member and officer, maintaining a 3.4 GPA. She has also been very active in many of her high school activities.
