The club will meet again Saturday, July 14, 2:30 p.m., also at the City Park in lone.

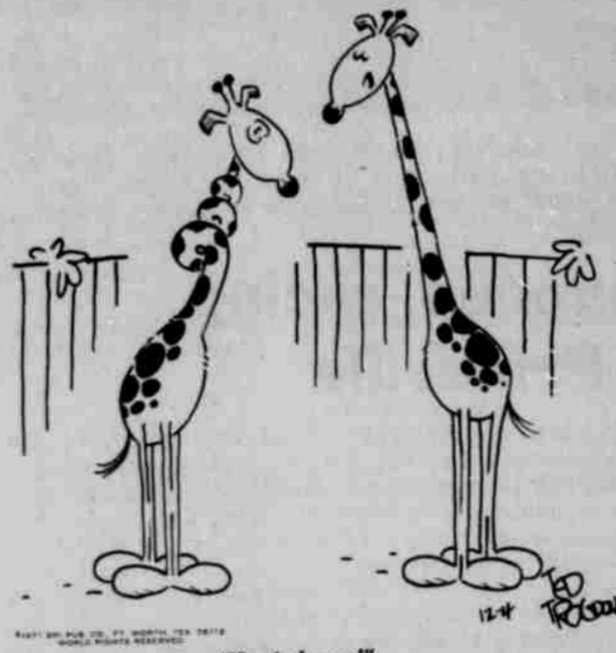
