The lieutenant is returning to Columbus AFB, Miss., where he serves with a unit of the Air Training Command.

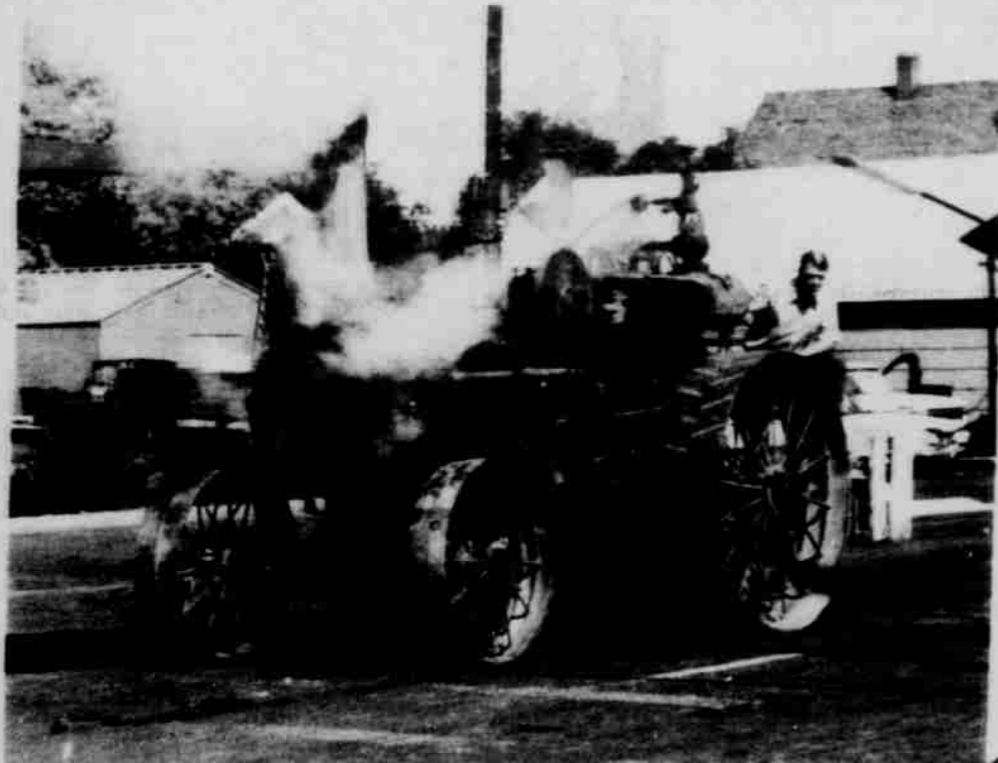
