Can TV sets be shut off?

David Harrison, manager of Columbia Basin Electric, has initiated plans to make a study of the effect of football field lighting as to total electrical consumption of the area during an evening football game.

Bonneville Power Administration will assist by picking up at the substation and taking the demand metering charts from the Condon and Heppner areas to the Columbia Basin office on Monday, Sept. 17. Columbia Basin Electric Co-operative will then report the demands established during the games of the evening of Sept. 14. Comparison will be made to previous Fridays and the evenings previous.

Harrison suggests that if all those attending the games will turn television sets and turn all lights off except for security lighting, there is a good possibility that these savings will offset the usage at the "lighted" football fields. The co-op manager said that income at the gate is important to the schools. He felt that the community involvement in the events is even more important—with games at

night this is possible. Harrison stated that the electric energy deficiencies can be overcome by voluntary cooperation. He said that the people of the area would now have a chance this Friday night to "prove themselves."
