

# Mustangs lose to Condon, 22-7

The Heppner Mustangs were defeated by the Condon Blue Devils Friday night at Condon, 22-7.

"Condon played a great ball game while we fumbled and had passes intercepted in key plays," said Mustang Coach Chuck Starr in describing Friday night's loss.

The Blue Devils scored first in the second quarter on a 16 yard run by Bryce Logan. The try for the 2 point conversion failed and Condon led 6-0.

Later in the period the Mustangs got back into the ball game on a 4 yard pass

play from Gentry to McLeod. Matt Greenup kicked the PAT and the Mustangs led 7-6.

In the third quarter the Blue Devils scored again when Dave Eaton intercepted a Mustang pass and ran the ball back 62 yards for the TD. The try for the extra points, Logan to Shearer, was good. Condon led 14-7.

The fourth quarter saw the same two Blue Devils set up another score as Shearer took a pass from Logan and galloped 22 yards for another TD. The try for the extra points, Logan to Eaton, was a

pass completion good for 2 points.

The gun ended the ball game with the final score Condon 22, Heppner 7.

Stats for Friday night's game: First downs, (H) 5, (C) 8; Net yards rushing, (H) 20, (C) 89; Net yards passing, (H) 52, (C) 73; Penalties, (H) 35, (C) 20.

Jerry Gentry completed 8x27 pass for 52 yards,

including one TD. Mike Bergstrom gained 17 yards in 7 carries and John Boyer averaged 33.4 yards per punt.

Tonight the Mustangs meet the Pilot Rock Rockets at the Fairgrounds, with game time at 8 p.m.

This is a crucial game for the Mustangs, as they must win their remaining four league games to stay in contention for a first place tie.

Condon presently holds the league lead; however, it faces Weston-McEwen this week and a win by the Scotties would place the Columbia Basin League contenders in a three-way tie for first place.

Should this happen, the Azzi Point System will be used to determine the winner in the league. The Azzi system awards the winner of each league game plus points, while

the losing team receives minus points, up to and including 10 points.

Heppner would have to win its next four games by at least 10 points and hope the Blue Devils and the Scotties scores are close. Should this happen the winner would be determined by adding all the plus points and subtracting the minus points.

## 5,000 hunters in area observe rules, mostly

Opening day of deer season found many local hunters getting their buck and returning home sooner than anticipated. Some of the men had their limit and were home by noon Saturday.

One hunter and his party were back in Heppner with three bucks, two forked horns, and a four point, by 10 a.m.

Game Biologist Glen Ward said he was pleased with the way most of the 5,000 hunters in this area co-operated with the Oregon State Game Com-

mission and State Fish and Game Department deputies.

"When you have that many hunters in the area, you are bound to have a few who either don't know the law or are inexperienced hunters," said Ward, who was referring to two elk killed in this area. A spike elk was shot Saturday and the carcass was found by

another party of hunters late Sunday. Ward was notified of the violation. The meat was spoiled.

Another hunter shot a five-point elk, but he was seen by a local hunter. The violator, after shooting the elk, made for his truck and left the scene. Ward was again notified and he brought the

carcass into Heppner, after it was field dressed. The elk weighed 365 pounds and will be given to the Morrow County Welfare Department for distribution.

There are reports of other minor violations. However, none have been reported to local authorities, and no arrests have been made.
