# Library usage, like stock market, is off

Heppner Public Library has seen its usage drop almost as badly as Wall Street has this month.

Records kept by the retired librarian Mrs. Blanch Brown show that in July 461 books were circulated, August 588, September 590 and last month 496. This month's records show that just over 200 books have been checked out through Nov. 26.

It would seem that as books become more expensive to buy that free public libraries would show greater circulation. Some Heppner people have made the library a regular stop at least every two weeks—but many don't seem to realize this institution exists.

Three volunteers have contributed helping hands this month. Lesley Patching, Grant Weatherford and Debbie Peck Olson have given work time.

Nine new borrower's cards have been filled out so far this month—which may help bring the circulation up again next month.

One male patron suggested that hunting season may have

cut into people's reading habits. A further check of Mrs. Brown's records shows that November circulation for the last five years has been considerably more than it is this month: 1968-470 books, 1969-452; 1970-365; 1971-324; last year 323.

Would a change in library hours or days help increase the circulation of books? Suggestions to improve the library usage will be welcomed by the librarian.
