6. Test and clean or renew spark plugs.
7. Check engine oil dipstick for sealing.
8. Test exhaust system with analyzer and check system for leakage.
9. Check exhaust manifold heat valve.
10. Adjust ignition timing and carburetor idle speed and mixture.
11. Check automatic choke mechanism for free operation.
12. Inspect air cleaner and element.
13. Test distributor vacuum control switch and transmission control switch.
