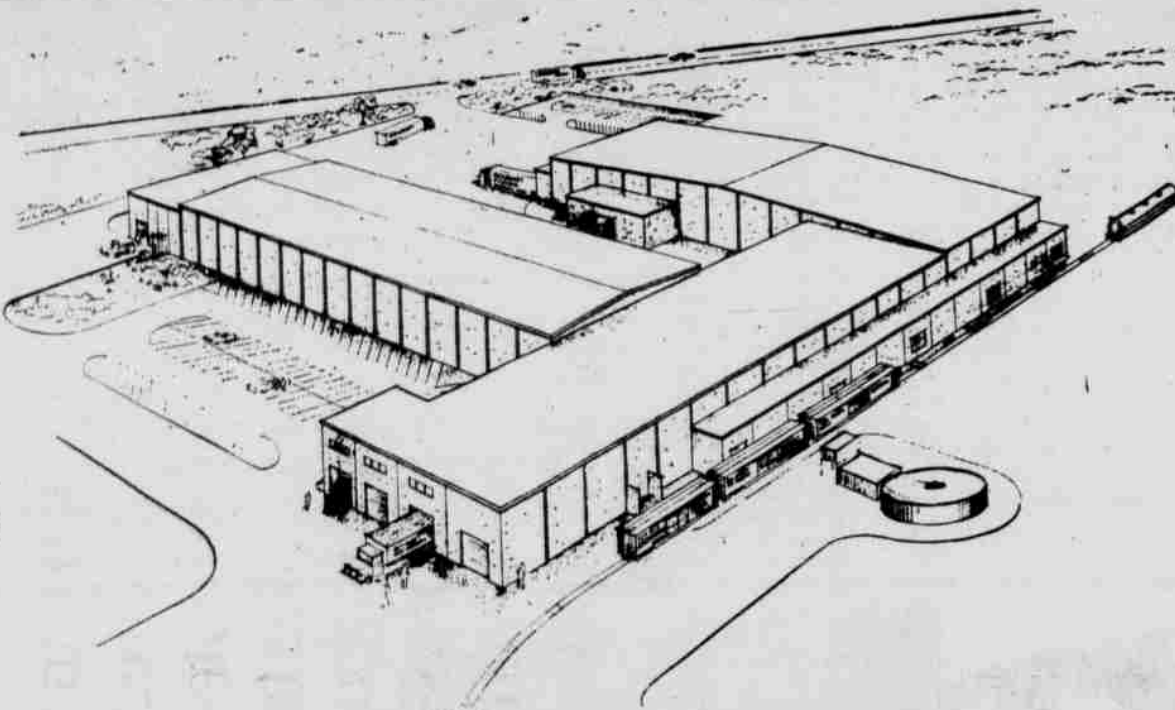
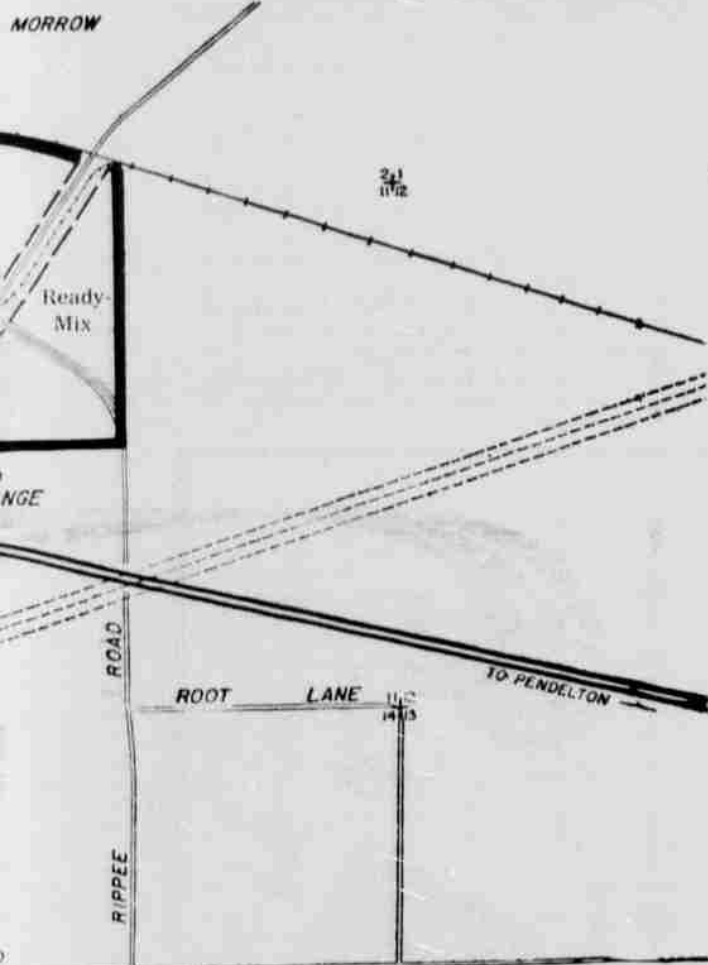

Boardman potato plant construction to begin

BOARDMAN - Construction will begin this week on the \$4,850,000 frozen french fried potato processing plant at the Port of Morrow east of here.

The new facility will be leased by Gourmet Foods Products Inc., Melolius, Ore., and will employ about 175 workers by September.

The facility is being financed through a Port of Morrow 25-year revenue bond issue which was purchased this week by Foster and Marshall, Inc., Seattle.

Robert O. Yeasting, vice president, said there will be an approximate \$3,400,000 bond issue for plant construction and \$1,450,000 for the cold storage facility.

The bonds will pay an interest rate of approximately 6.25 per cent.

Gourmet Food Products

Inc., will own the food processing equipment and lease the cold storage building and freezing tunnel from Techbuilt Corp., a Bellevue firm.

Norman Hyder, president of Gourmet Food Products, said the firm already owns a plant near Madras producing french fried and hash brown potatoes.

He said the second plant was

needed because of increased demand and predicted the Hermiston area will continue to grow as a potato producer.

Gourmet will buy potatoes from local growers in the Hermiston-Boardman area and contracts have already been negotiated for 24,000 acres.

Jim Fitzgerald, president of Techbuilt, said their employees will build the freeze tunnel and cold storage plant.

It was at an annual meeting of the Heppner - Boardman Soil & Water Conservation District meeting in February of 1967 that the Port of Morrow first presented its multiple use Nuclear Power Plant plan for Morrow County.

With about 100 ranchers present, the consensus of the meeting was to proceed with the promotion. The state soil and water people responded to the district wishes and contoured the nuclear cooling reservoirs with irrigation, prepared a four-color map that professionally presented the multiple use project (one of the finest in the nation), provided the Navy is moved. The utilities have responded.

We'll see you at your annual meeting Feb. 5, 1974 at the Lexington Grange Hall, seven years later, and count our blessings.
