The board also approved three concession stands to be operated by the American Association of University Women, on the same division of profit formula.

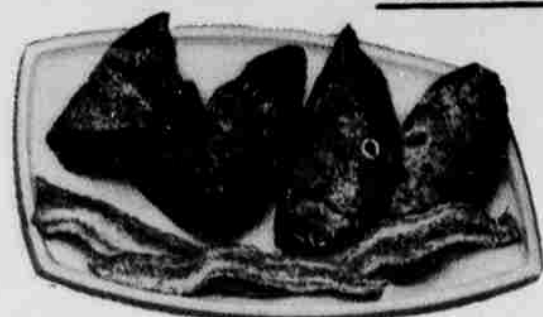
In other business, the board voted to hold the coronation of the Morrow County Rodeo Queen and Court in June. The Soroptimist Club of Heppner will be in charge of the event.
