NOTICE OF ACTION PLAN AND ITS EFFECTS ON FEDERAL-AID HIGHWAY PROJECTS

The Oregon State Highway
Division has prepared an
"Action Plan," more com-
monly referred to as "Process
Guidelines," in conformance
with Policy and Procedures
of, and promulgated by, the
Federal Highway Adminis-
tration.

The "Action Plan" is di-
rected for assuring full con-
sideration of the human and
environmental effects of
Federal-Aid projects, by in-
fluencing the methods by
which such projects are de-
veloped in utilizing a syste-
matic and interdisciplinary
approach. Further, the plan
describes the procedures that
must be employed in planning
and designing proposed trans-
portation projects, and as-
surance that the decisions on
such projects will be made in
the best overall public interest
with proper public involve-
ment.

mation developed by the State
Highway Division and written
views received as a result of
