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Use post office box numbers

Postal patrons in the future should furnish their correspondents with their correct box numbers, according to Postmaster Hubert C. Wilson.

Having mail come to the Heppner Post Office addressed to only "John Doe, Heppner, Ore." is not sufficient.

"There are too many people coming and going for our personnel to remember the names of local residents and their box numbers," Wilson said.

Used to be, he said, that postal workers knew everybody in the county by name and box number.

Notices announcing the new rule were placed in post office boxes last week.

Individuals and business firms who have printed letterheads and envelopes are requested to include the post office box number in the return address on the envelope.

The move is calculated to provide better and faster service, Wilson said.
