NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that written, sealed bids will be received at the offices of the City Recorder of the City of Heppner, Oregon, City Hall, on or before the 1st day of April, 1974, at the hour of 2:00 p.m., Pacific Daylight Saving Time, and immediately thereafter publicly opened for the purchase of \$450,000.00 general obligation bonds of the City of Heppner, Morrow County, Oregon. Said bonds shall be in denominations of \$1,000.00 each, to bear interest at the rate, or rates, not to exceed 6 per cent per annum in any one year, payable semi-annually, principal and interest to be payable at the office of the Treasurer of the City of Heppner, Oregon. Said bonds shall be dated April 1, 1974, and shall mature serially as follows:

Said bonds shall be sold to the highest responsible bidder for not less than 98 per cent of their par value and the entire amount of accrued interest thereon, and to the bidder offering the lowest effective rate to the City of Heppner, taking into consideration and account such premiums as are offered, or discounts offered, and such items of cost as have been, or shall be, charged by the bidder in connection with the purchase and delivery of said bonds, with interest being computed to the respective maturity date.

A certified check on a bank doing business in the State of Oregon equal to 2 per cent of the par value of said bonds must accompany the bid as evidence of good faith on the part of the bidder. The opinion of Rankin, Walsh, Ragen and Roberts, Attorneys at Law, Portland, Oregon, shall be deemed sufficient as to the legality of the issuance and obligation of said bonds. The bid must also contain notice of the total interest cost of the issue under the terms of the bonds. In computing the interest, no one year may exceed 6 per cent per annum. The City of Heppner, Oregon, shall make the award of the sale of the bonds at 8:00 o'clock p.m., Pacific Daylight Time, on April 1, 1974, but reserves the right to reject any and all bids received.
