NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that written, sealed bids will be received at the offices of the City Recorder of the City of Heppner, Oregon, City Hall, on or before the 1st day of April, 1974, at the hour of 2:00 p.m., Pacific Daylight Saving Time, and immediately thereafter publicly opened for the purchase of \$450,000.00 general obligation bonds of the City of Heppner, Morrow County, Oregon. Said bonds shall be in denominations of \$1,000.00 each, to bear interest at the rate, or rates, not to exceed 6 per cent per annum in any one year, payable semi-annually, principal and interest to be payable at the office of the Treasurer of the City of Heppner, Oregon.
