

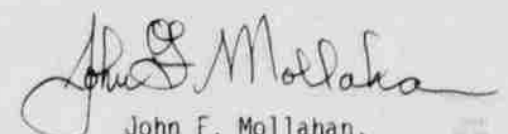
Notice of Service of Personal Property Tax Warrants

NOTICE is hereby given pursuant to ORS. 311.615 of the service of Personal Property Tax Warrants upon the following listed taxpayers. Payment of the following listed delinquent taxes with interest and costs of service must be made by April 15, 1974 or said warrants shall be filed with the County Clerk of Morrow County, Oregon to be entered in the judgment docket of said County and shall become a lien upon the title to any interest in real property owned by the person against whom the warrant is issued, and the taxes on personal property embraced in the warrant with interest, penalties and costs applicable thereto, shall continue as a lien on all the personal property of the person assessed as otherwise provided by law. The effect shall be the same as though the people of the County had recovered the judgment against the person charged for the full amount of the delinquent taxes covered by the warrant together with interest thereon and cost as provided by law.

Survey being made of unschooled children

The 1973 Oregon Legislature in House Bill 2444 requires all school districts in Oregon to "conduct surveys of education and other needs of children not in school and report results to the Department of Education on or before July 1, 1974."

A unified, county-wide identification effort is being conducted in all attendance areas in Morrow County. The district is seeking the names of all out-of-school children between the ages of 7 and 21 who have not graduated from high school, and all handicapped youngsters between the ages

of birth and 21 who are not receiving educational services.

Ernie Teal, curriculum administrative assistant, is coordinator for the identification survey.

Teal is asking the people of Morrow County to support and assist in the identification survey. He said, "If the survey is to be conclusive and valid, it will require the people of Morrow County be informed and participate in the identification of these children." If anyone knows of such a person, he is asked to call the

school administration office, 989-8123.

"The identification survey," Teal said, "will be coordinated through the district office, and the principals have been organized to assist in the survey. Personal contacts will be made to public agencies, organizations, and professional persons in the area in search of names of handicapped or special children not being served presently by the schools."

"Confidentiality is extremely important and will be strictly observed," Teal said.

As a result, a special coding system has been developed. The curriculum coordinator will be the only person with access to the HB 2444 file, and knowledge of the code, in order to protect the name of the identified child, and also the name of the person making the referral.

Once the survey is completed, the results will be forwarded to the State Board of Education for consideration in drafting legislation to seek funds for special education programs.
