bids will be received at the

the City of Heppner, Oregon,
City Hall, on or before the 3rd
day of June, 1974, at the hour
of 2:00 p.m., Pacific Daylight
Savings Time, and immedi-
ately thereafter publicly
opened for the purchase of
\$450,000 general obligation
bonds of the City of Heppner,
Morrow County, Oregon. Said
bonds shall be in denomina-
tions of \$1,000 each, to bear
interest at the rate, or rates,
not to exceed 6 per cent per
annum in any one year as
shall be specified by the
successful bidder, payable
semi-annually on April 1 and
October 1, principal and
interest to be payable at the
office of the Treasurer of the
City of Heppner, Oregon. Said
bonds shall be dated April 1,
1974, and shall mature serially

obligation of said bonds. The

o'clock p.m., Pacific Daylight

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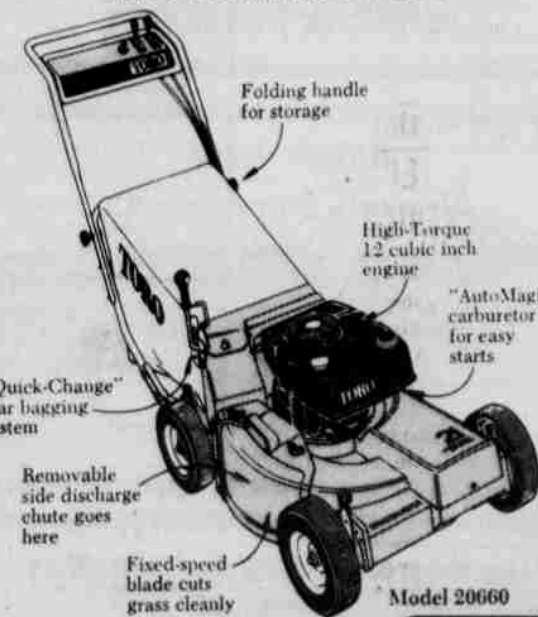
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
