ON TO STATE

A successful 1974 track season started in late March and ended May 17 & 18 with 5 members traveling under the supervision of their coaches to the state track meet at Pleasant Hills.

There were two on the boys track team this year. Returning Senior Phil Carlson and Sophomore LeRoy Rea. They were under the supervision of Gordon Meyers.

Phil ran the 180 yard low hurdles and high jumped. Phil broke the high jump record at the Condon Inaugural with a jump of 6'4" and qualified at the District meet for state.

LeRoy also high jumped and ran the 180 yard low hurdles. The girls team had 7 members. They were Seniors-Micki Hoskins and Mary Pat McElligott; Junior-Sherri Wilson; Sophomores-Terry McElligott and Catherine McElligott; and Freshmen-Joan Doherty and Debbie Patton. Mrs. Stefani was their coach and Laurie Childers was manager.

Micki ran in the 100 yard dash, 880 medley, 440 relay and participated in the long jump.

Catherine ran the 220 yard dash, 440 relay and the 880 medley relay.

Joan ran the 220 yard dash, 440 relay and the 880 medley relay.

Debbie ran the 110 yard low hurdles, 440 relay and 880 medley relay.

At the District meet Micki Hoskins qualified for the long jump at state and the 440 yard relay with Mary Pat McElligott, Catherine McElligott and Debbie Patton.
