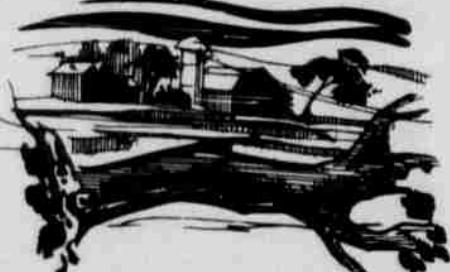
Atkins reunion Sunday William J. Bucknum dies in Portland

Jesse James Atkins came from Missouri to Oregon in 1853 when he was five years old. He lived with his parents in Lane County until 1869 when he came to this area; then to Umatilla County, to settle 18 miles southwest of Heppner on Rhea Creek. The Atkins and the pioneer families of Columbus Rhea and Crockett Kirk are related. Twenty-five of Pioneer

Atkin's kin held a reunion here Sunday. They did lots of visiting, enjoyed the local museum, and had Sunday dinner in the Methodist Church dining room. Mary Elinor Snow, daughter of Ed Atkins, seems to be the only direct descendant of Jesse James Atkins, who is still living here. Most of those attending the reunion came from Yakima, Wn.

William Joseph Buckum, 66, died at Good Samaritan Hospital in Portland, Monday, May 27, after a long illness. He was born July 31, 1907 in Greene, New York. In 1914 he moved to Heppner from Portland. For many years he operated Bucknum's Tavern, and was also a retired rancher. On Dec. 25, 1929, he was married to Cecelia Kenny in Heppner. He was a member of St. Patrick's Church, the Holy Name Society and a 45-year member of BPOE No. 358, Heppner. One brother, Edwin, preceded him in death. Besides his wife, Cecelia,

Heppner, he is survived by two brothers, John Gordon Bucknum, West Linn, Ore., and Elmer J. Bucknum, LaCanada, Ca.; and numerous nieces and nephews in the area. Recitation of the Rosary was Wednesday, May 29, at 8 p.m. at St. Patrick's Church in Heppner. Funeral mass is today, May 30, at 10 a.m. at St. Patrick's Church with the Rev. John O'Brien officiating. Interment will be in the Heppner Masonic Cemetery with Sweeney Mortuary in charge of arrangements. Donations may be made to the Cancer Society or the charity of one's choice in Mr. Bucknum's name.
