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Swim team loses at Hermiston

The Heppner Swim Team had its first meet of the season June 20 when it took on Hermiston and Milton-Freewater at Hermiston.

Hermiston won the event with 502½ points, Milton-Freewater 148½ and Heppner 9. One of the reasons for Heppner's poor showing is the lack of swimmers participating in the events. Heppner had only 13 members.

Heppner's Swim Team was organized last year, and participated in only two meets—the Prineville Invitational and a dual meet at Baker.

The team needs more members to compete in the Eastern Oregon district of swim teams. The team has 24 members from 6-16. Anyone under 18 may join. Practice is from 12 noon to 1 p.m. and 4 to 5 p.m., weekdays.

On June 24 the The Dalles swim team traveled to Heppner to face the 25-member local team in its second meet of the season. Heppner came out on top amassing 395 total points against their opponent's 329.

CIRCULATION RECORD SET ON MONDAY
