Singled out as a club that has given consistent and unique service to its community, the Soroptimist Club of Heppner received the 1972-74 "That's Who" award at the 23rd biennial convention of the Soroptimist Federation of the Americas in Portland, June 30-July 4.

The award was given to 200 clubs out of a total of 969. Receiving the club's award

Mrs. Peterson was accompanied by her sister, Phyllis Wise, Dothan, Ala. More than 1,000 executive and professional women are attending the convention which has more than 30,000 members.

Granges support hospital levy

Two granges have endorsed the serial levy of \$56,573 to provide funds for Pioneer Memorial Hospital.

On June 14 Rhea Creek Grange No. 669 voted to support the levy, which will be up for voter approval on July 16.

At the Morrow County Pomona Grange meeting at Boardman, June 29, Archie Becholdt, legislative chairman of Rhea Creek Grange, spoke of the need for retaining the hospital, the only one serving Morrow and most of Wheeler and Gilliam counties. He pointed out that the lack of funds would probably result in the closing of both the hospital and its associated nursing home.

"Though the hospital is not of such vital importance to the

north end of the county," he said, "it would be in the best interests of the county as a whole" if Boardman area voters would support the levy.

In May 1905 they moved to Ione where Watt Brashers died on Oct. 23, 1915.

She married Dale Spencer Ray on Oct. 23, 1920 at Condon, and they made their home in Ione until 1964 when they moved to Lyle, Wa., to be with their sons. Mr. Ray died in November 1965.
