NOTICE OF A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD IN THE CITY OF HEPPNER, OREGON, ON JULY 29, 1974, FOR THE PURPOSE OF ADOPTING OR REJECTING THE PROPOSED 1974 REVISED CHARTER FOR THE CITY OF HEPPNER, IS HEREBY GIVEN.

Pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance No. 392 passed by the Common Council of the City of Heppner, Oregon, there will be a special election held upon the 29th day of July, 1974, at the City Hall in Heppner, Oregon, commencing at 8:00 a.m. and continuing until 8:00 p.m., Pacific Daylight Time, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of the City of Heppner the proposition of adopting or rejecting the proposed

revised Charter for Heppner. Copies of the proposed revised Charter are now posted at the City Hall, the United States Postoffice, the Morrow County Courthouse, the Bank of Eastern Oregon, the First National Bank of Oregon, and Murray's Drug Store; all in the City of Heppner, Oregon.

The following qualified persons are hereby appointed Clerks and Judges to conduct the special election, to-wit: Dolores Gribble, Ruby Beck, Marget Dubuque, Laurel VanMarter.

The following shall be submitted to the electors of the City of Heppner for their approval or rejection, to-wit: "Shall the legal voters of the City of Heppner repeal the revised Charter of the City of Heppner adopted on the 20th day of December, 1918, and all amendments thereto, and adopt the proposed revised Charter for the City of Heppner, entitled 'THE REVISED CHARTER OF 1974 OF THE CITY OF HEPPNER.'" Said ballots shall also contain the words, "Yes, I vote for the proposed revised Charter" and "No, I vote against the proposed revised Charter"; which ballot each voter shall mark and cast according to law as each such voter may desire to vote.
