## Phebe's 100th birthday celebration planned

Sunday, Aug. 4, Phebe Ann Thomson Bartholomew will become 100 years old.

This lively lady will be honored at an open house (no invitations—no gifts) at the Civic Recreation Center in Hermiston from 2 to 4 p.m. when her relatives, friends and admirers will gather to share her big day. Family members are expected from as far away as New York and Georgia.

She was born on the Thomson Farm on Butter Creek, Aug. 4, 1874 (this place is now owned by her grandson, Jerry Myers).

This spring Phebe set out a large bed of flowers now blooming in front of the section of the Good Samaritan Home at Hermiston, where she has lived the last several years. She spends part of each day sitting outside near them, knitting lap robes and visiting. She has given more than 30 completed robes away. She still reads books and the daily papers, "especially the obituaries and Ann Landers."

Phebe entered the college at Monmouth, Ore., in 1893. As a member of its class of 1895 she helped organize its alumni

association in 1943 at the 50th reunion of her class. She taught at Pine City two years and at the Thomson School one year before her marriage to Charles Herbert Bartholomew, who lived until 1954. Phebe has four children, nine grandchildren, eight great-grandchildren.

Her daughters, Faye Finch, Hermiston, and Lila Myers, Pine City, are making arrangements for the birthday party and invite all Phebe's friends to attend.

## Food tips bulletins available
