Heppner's Swim Team is organized for the summer under the coaching of Judy Gentry.

Some 25 swimmers are participating, but more are encouraged to join the team. All children under 17 who can swim may join, according to Miss Gentry. Competitors are classed by age and there are classes for swimmers as young as 5 and 6 years.

Miss Gentry stressed that participation on the team gives youngsters the opportunity to learn good sportsmanship, team work, and affords them the opportunity of meeting other swimmers in other towns.

Parents of team members organized Tuesday, July 16, calling themselves the Heppner Swim Team Parents. President of the group is Sonny Biddle; secretary-treasurer, Wilma Marlatt; publicity, Shirley George; and ways and means, Gail Arbogast.

Raising money to sponsor the swim meets held in Heppner is the main activity of the group. Ninety dollars was raised at the concession stand during Sidewalk Sales. The spring rummage sale will

be operated by the group. Co-chairmen for the sale are Wilma Marlatt, Joyce Ward and Shirley Conner.

Starting blocks, used in the swim competition, have been made for the Heppner pool by Kinzua Corp.
