

Ione schools open Sept. 3 Fair results . . . Irrigon

Opening date for Ione Public Schools is set for Tuesday, Sept. 3, beginning at the regular time, 8:35 a.m. Buses will run on their regular morning schedule and will contact families on their routes to confirm pickup times. All classes will be dismissed early on the first day at 1:30 p.m. Buses will run at 1:35 p.m.

Regular dismissal times are as follows: kindergarten, 11:05 a.m.; grades 1 and 2, 2:30 p.m.; grade 3, 2:45 p.m.; grade 4, 3 p.m. (will change to 3:15 after first semester); grade 5 through 12, 3:15 p.m.

Lunch times for students are as follows: grades 1-4, 11:15 a.m.; grades 5-6, 11:30 a.m.; grades 7-8, 9-10, 11-12, 11:40 a.m.; 11:45 a.m., 11:50 a.m., rotating weekly.

Kindergarten students may remain for school lunch if arrangements are made with the school office.
