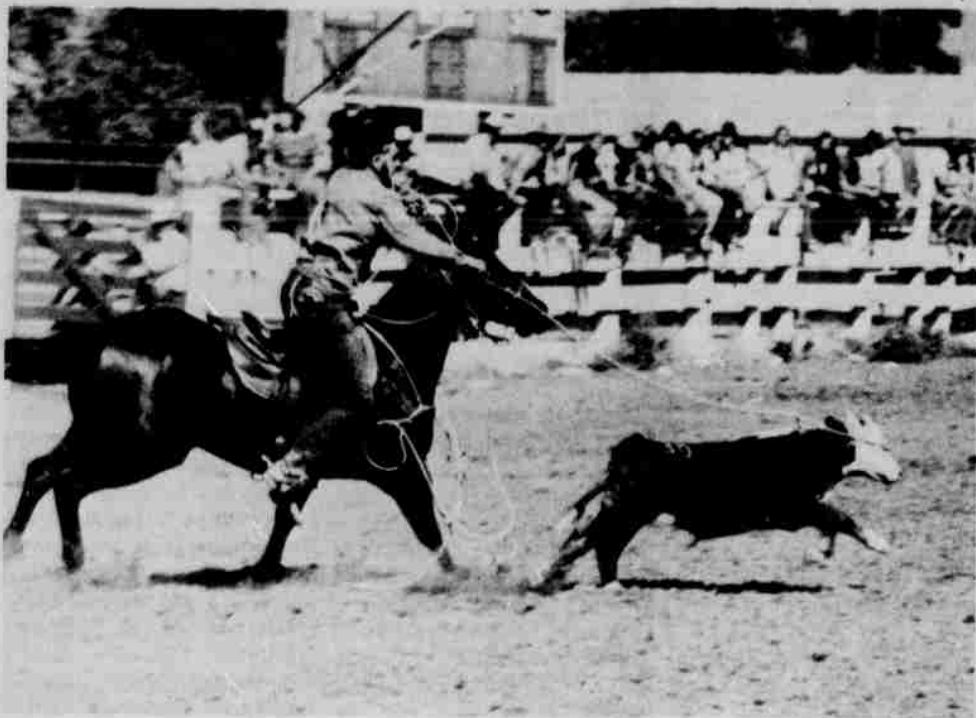




John Quintana tried his luck aboard Swivel. Better luck next year, John!
