Two fires in area man-made

Schools increase

At the beginning of the second week of school, Morrow County School District showed a significant increase in enrollment over the same time a year ago.

Last year's enrollment was 1106; the current year's enrollment is 1282.

Of the new increase, 77 are kindergarten children enrolled for the first time in the district-sponsored program, and 99 are students new to the district.

Largest percentage increases came in the north end of the county where Riverside High School showed a 9 per cent increase. New enrollment at Riverside is 219 students in grades 7-12.

A.C. Houghton Elementary in Irrigon has an increase of 9 per cent for a total of 234 students. Heppner Elementary and Heppner High School showed significant increases also. Heppner Elementary enrollment stands at 420 in grades K-8, and Heppner High School's enrollment is 205 in grades 9-12. Lone enrollment is up also, with 100 students in high school and 104 in the elementary school.

Youth jailed, drugs

Glenn D. Vencill, 18, formerly of Norfolk, Va., has been sentenced to 30 days in jail on charges of criminal use of drugs.

Vencill was arrested by the sheriff's department last Wednesday in Heppner. He appeared before Justice of the Peace Charles O'Connor Thursday and pled guilty to the charge. He said he was using three types of narcotics as "downers," but said he couldn't identify them. The pills were sent to Pendleton for laboratory examination. However, at the time of the trial they had not been positively identified.

O'Connor set Vencill's bail at \$1,005, then sentenced him to 30 days in the county jail in lieu of bail.

Vencill told officers he had been in trouble with the law before and that he was on probation for robbery. He refused to state the nature of the crimes, but said they had been committed in Norfolk, and that he had not reported to his probation officer for two years.

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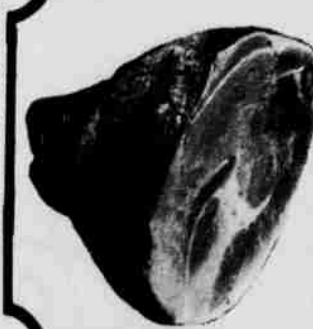
