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honor of being selected for the Order of the Arrow.

During the summer of 1973 Bruce attended Camp Wallowa with 24 other scouts from Troop 661. Bruce was assistant senior patrol leader by this time. The troop was camped at the Moccasin Camp Site known as "Heart Attack Hill" among scout masters because it is not only the highest camp at Wallowa Lake but it is also the farthest from the main headquarters. During this camp Bruce functioned as troop fire runner. He had the good fortune of running two round trips during false alarms. He also learned to sail on Wallowa Lake.

In the summer of 1973 Bruce went through his ordeal with the Order of the Arrow at Camp Wallowa.

On Aug. 21, 1973, he attained the rank of Life Scout. He was also elevated to the position of senior patrol leader. As a Life Scout he participated in the Oregon Trail District's Round Table which plans scouting activities for the Oregon Trail District.

He also attended the Freezer held at Cutsforth Park in December of 1973 and was elected by the senior patrol leaders from the other troops as the senior patrol leader of the Freezer. He also served as master of ceremonies at the camp fire.

In spite of his increased rank and scouting experience he was unsuccessful in changing the December weather pattern because we again awakened to approximately one foot of snow the first morning out.

In May of 1974 he attended the Oregon Trail District Camporee at Cold Spring Reservoir. He acted as scout master during this camp out since the Oregon Trail District organized the scout masters into their own patrol and segregated them from their troops; the purpose behind this experiment was to see how well the individual troops were organized and whether or not they could function without adult leadership. Bruce and his fellow scouts functioned well. You may be interested to know that the scout masters' patrol was rated the lowest in the entire camp primarily because of

insubordination on the part of the adult leaders.

Bruce also participated in the Order of the Arrow Tapout Ceremonies held at the Cold Springs Reservoir. During this period he was elected secretary of the Order of the Arrow for the Oregon Trail District and in June of 1974 Bruce attained Brotherhood Membership in the Order of the Arrow.

In June of 1974 Bruce appeared before the Board of Review. In August of 1974 he participated in Troop 661's week-long 50 mile hike into the Wallowa wilderness area and earned his 50-mile award. This in essence means he back-packed everything in and out that he used during the entire week. He also holds the Historic Trail Award which he had earned in the spring of 1973.

Bruce has given many hours of his time in public service projects including but not limited to his organizational effort to clean Hager Park for the City of Heppner.

At the present time Bruce is serving as junior assistant scout master.

Bruce has demonstrated his leadership abilities in many ways and throughout his entire scouting career has helped less experienced scouts and imparted the knowledge and skills that he has acquired to any who desired his help.

He has been a stalwart in leadership and consequently we are justifiably proud of him this evening.

Rate down, taxes up

The tax rate for Morrow County is down on an average of \$1.23 per \$1,000 evaluation, but budget increases of \$312,146 over 1973-74 could amount to a 12.56 per cent increase in the property tax.

The 18-1/4 per cent budget increase is due to an increase of the county school budget of \$202,000; an increase for Blue Mountain Community College of \$58,000; and an increase in hospital budgeting of \$34,000.

According to the County Assessors Office, individual property tax relief, especially for senior citizens and low income families, can be filed for through the Department of Revenue.
