

Ione defeats Dufur, 50-38

The Dufur Rangers were defeated 50-38 by the Ione Cardinals at Ione's homecoming game Friday.

Although the Rangers lost the ball game they seemed to take the defeat proudly, having led the Cardinals during the first quarter and at half time. In their past two games the Rangers had gone down to defeat by scores of 74-0 and prior to this game they were defeated 80-0.

Cardinal Coach Gordon Meyers did not want his Cardinals to beat the Ione Cardinals by such a vast margin, so he played most of the first half of the game using all the substitutes available on offense.

In the first quarter, the Dufur Rangers scored when Mike Taylor ran 66 yards. Terry Uhalde scored the extra two points.

Paul Peterson, Ione, then ran 31 yards for a Cardinal TD, but the kick for the PAT failed.

Still in the first quarter, Taylor scored again on a 19 yard run with Paul DePriest adding the extra two points. As the quarter ended Dufur led Ione 16-6.

In the second quarter, Ione's Aaron Klinger scored for the Cardinals from the one yard line, with Charlie McElligott passing to Joel Peterson for the PAT.

Dufur's Taylor scored for the Rangers from the one yard line and Uhalde added the extra point for the Rangers.

Later in the same period, Mike Warren scored again for the Cardinals from the seven yard line. The PAT failed, and as the half ended the Rangers led Ione 24-20.

In the first play from scrimmage in the second half, Warren scored for the Cardinals on a 50 yard run. The PAT failed.

Rick Peterson, who has been playing center for the Cardinals for the past few years, had asked Coach Meyers if there was any way he could score before the season

ends, as this is his last year of play for the Cards.

Meyers put Peterson in as a fullback and on his first three carries Rick made three first downs for Ione.

Peterson eventually scored his first TD for the Cards, going over from the four yard line. Joe Rietmann passed to Todd Peterson for the two points, and the Cards led 34-24 as the third quarter ended.

In the fourth quarter, Taylor scored for the Rangers on a five yard run, with DePriest running for the PAT.

Ione's Aaron Klinger got his hands on the ball and ran 21 yards for the Cardinal TD, with Warren kicking the extra point.

Paul Peterson, Ione, then ran the ball for 32 yards and another Ione score, and the PAT failed.

Later in the fourth quarter, Charlie McElligott kicked a 10 yard field goal.

The final score for the Rangers came when Taylor caught a pass from DePriest and ran 28 yards.

The statistics for the game are as follows: net yards rushing, Ione 370, Dufur 275; net yards passing, Ione 86, Dufur 75.

After the game both coaches congratulated each other on the sportsmanship shown in the ball game and Head Coach Tom Forsythe, Dufur was pleased with the Cardinal coaches and the way they rotated their players.

Coach Meyers said, "It was a fun game and we could have run up the score on the Rangers, but as long as we beat them by 12 points that is all that matters. I only hope that it will boost the moral of the boys playing on the Ranger team. They sure need it after last week's defeat, 80-0."

This Friday the Cardinals host Stanfield at Ione. Meyers said this game will match the Cardinals with one of their stiffest competitors. Game time is 2 p.m.

6th ranked Mustangs rout Umatilla, 43-0

Heppner's Mustangs, rated sixth in Oregon's class A football, defeated the Umatilla Vikings on their home ground, 43-0, Friday.

The first score for the Mustangs came in the first quarter when Wade Padberg ran 43 yards for a TD. The PAT failed.

Minutes later Mike Orwick, who was playing at quarterback for the Mustangs, scored on a one yard run into the end zone. This time Gentry kicked the point after touchdown and the Mustangs led 13-0.

Just before the quarter ended Padberg took a punt return and raced 50 yards for another Mustang score. The PAT was short and the Mustangs led 19-0 at the end of the first quarter.

In the second quarter, Ken Eckman scored on a three yard run. The PAT failed.

John Kilkenny scored for

the Mustangs after he shifted position from his usual tackle spot, on a tackle pass eligible play, and scored on a 17 yard pass from Orwick. The point after failed.

As the half ended the Mustangs had a 31-0 lead over the Vikings. In the third and final quarters Padberg scored twice in each quarter on runs of five and 10 yards. Both attempts for the extra points failed. The final score was 43-0.

The Mustangs played without the services of Jerry Gentry, who normally plays quarterback, and who was used on special plays only. Substitutions were used during most of the game, but the Mustangs managed to score a total of 424 yards, both rushing

and passing, to their opponents 12 yards. The Mustangs netted 351 yards rushing and 73 yards in the air, while the Vikings netted 2 yards rushing and 10 yards in the air.

Padberg scored four Mustang TDs and gained 245 yards rushing in 17 carries for a 14.4 average. Eckman scored once, and gained 53 yards in 9 carries.

Thomas, Heppner, intercepted a pass and returned it for 30 yards before he was tackled. DeWayne McLain recovered a fumble for the Mustangs, and Dave Daly intercepted a pass and ran for 2 yards before he was tackled.

Friday, the Mustangs host Wasco County at the fairgrounds. Game time is 8 p.m.

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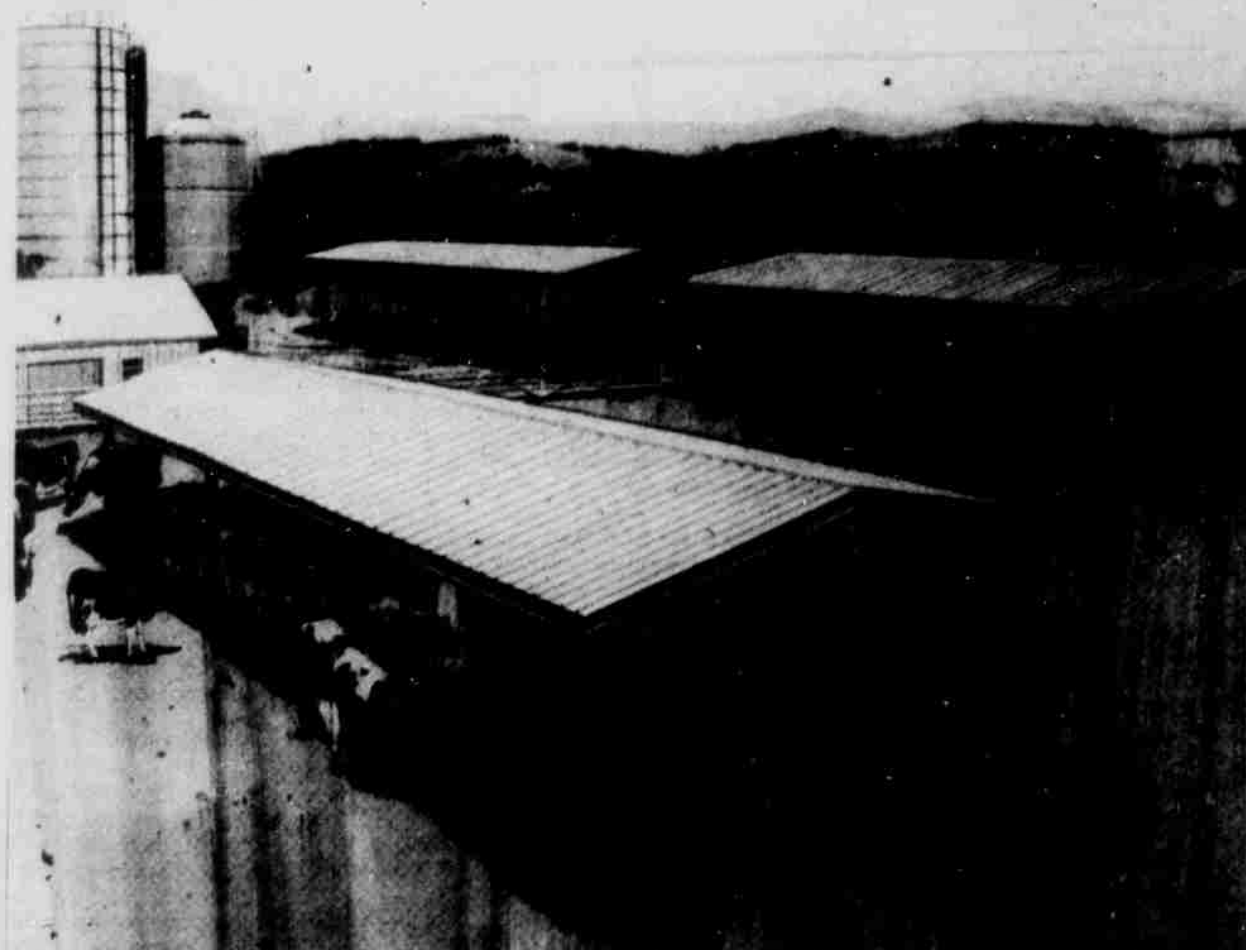
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
