Survivors include five sons: Henry, Stanfield; Harold, Heppner; James and Donald, Hermiston; George (Bud), Pendleton; two daughters, Eleanor Morey of Portland and Irene Nolan, Heppner; two brothers, James Yeager, Santa Clara, Ca., and Ralph Yeager, Redondo Beach, Ca.; 23 grandchildren, 44 great-grandchildren and two great-great-grandchildren.

Active pallbearers were grandsons: Donald, Ronald, Timothy, Richard and Lyle Peck and Vern Nolan. Honorary pallbearers included Gene Majeske, Kenneth Smouse, Norman Nelson, Paul Brown, Albert Nelson and Dean Hunt.

1974 farm census due this month

A crowing rooster on the 1974 Census of Agriculture poster proclaims, "Fill it out—Mail it back." The poster emphasizes the need for farmer cooperation in completing the agricultural census, which by federal law is taken once every five years.

Some 400 farm operators in Morrow County can look for their farm census forms in the mail just as soon as the Christmas rush is over, according to David McLeod, director of the ASCS office. The forms will be mailed directly to farmers by the Bureau of the Census. However, farmers who want explanations or help in completing the census questionnaire can turn to their county Agricultural Stabilization Conservation Service office for assistance.

Last rites for Mrs. Lutkins

Funeral services were held today, Thursday, Dec. 12, 2 p.m., at the First Christian Church for Maude Emma Lutkins, 79.

Mrs. Lutkins, late of Heppner, died Dec. 8 in Pendleton. She was a lifetime resident of the area, born Aug. 15, 1895 at Eightmile, the daughter of Daniel Scott Barlow and Maryetta Smith Barlow, Morrow County pioneers. She was a member of the Rhea Creek Grange. Her husband, Cecil, preceded her in death in 1969.

Rev. G. E. Nikander officiated at the services. Concluding services and vault interment were at Heppner Masonic Cemetery with Sweeney Mortuary in charge of arrangements.

Pallbearers were Rudy Bergstrom, Donald Peterson, Roland Bergstrom, Robert Peterson, Robert Jepson and Herbert Peterson.

Survivors include a brother, Everett Barlow, Pendleton; two sisters, Flora Schunk, Hermiston; and Dolly Allstott, Heppner; and numerous nieces and nephews.

Farmers are being asked to answer the questionnaires and return them by mail before the end of January if possible. "ASCS is cooperating with the census bureau to try to make sure that all farm operators are fully informed about the 1974 Census of Agriculture," McLeod said. "The census bureau will supply each county ASCS

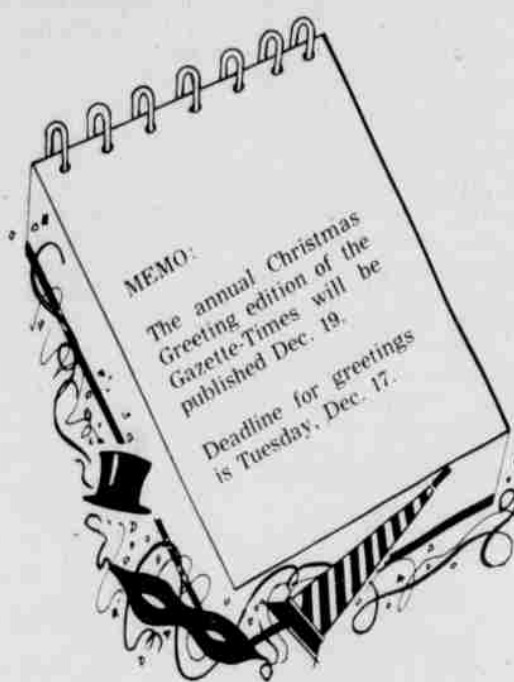
office with detailed information on the questions farmers most often ask about the census, and we will be glad to answer telephone queries if we can, or sit down with a farmer here in the office and go over the form in detail if asked."

The local ASCS official emphasized that census replies are confidential. "Here

in the ASCS office, we'll try to give a hand to anyone wanting a little help filling out the form, but we won't ask any questions about the farm data. That information goes to the census bureau and only to the census bureau, which takes special precautions to make sure that no information about any individual farm or farm operator goes to anyone inside or outside the government."

The facts and figures gathered in the farm census are processed and published as statistical data, with special publication of county and state reports as well as national agricultural statistics.

"Most farm operators know the need for accurate agricultural data, and I believe the census bureau will get just about 100 per cent voluntary cooperation from farmers in Morrow County," McLeod said. "However, it won't hurt to point out that federal law requires that census questions be answered accurately and completely, and a penalty can be imposed on anyone who doesn't."
