The audit report for the City of Irrigon for the year ending June 30, was presented and approved at the council meeting, Dec. 10.

Jim Thompson, administrator for the City of Boardman, was present at the meeting at Mayor Chester Wilson's invitation. After discussion of the need for increased police protection for the north end of the county, a resolution was adopted pledging participation by the City of Irrigon if a

program of funding could be developed to provide additional deputies.

Appreciation was expressed for the sheriff's departments activities in the area under limited manpower and resources conditions.

City Engineer Val Toronto was present to inform the council of some equipment changes for the water system, and received council endorsement.

A letter of resignation was

read from Municipal Judge Vestie Elgin, who was re-elected to the office in November on write-in votes. The resignation was accepted with regret by the council. Action to fill the office was deferred to the January meeting.
